A VIEW OF SOQOTRA

PROGRAM: Gary James will present a slide lecture on his recent trip to Soqotra (Gary's preferred spelling) in the company of expedition leader Bruno Mies of the University of Dusseldorf, John Lavranos and others. Soqotra is an island about 70 miles long by 35 miles wide lying in the Arabian Sea east of the horn of Africa. It is part of Yemen which occupies the southwestern part of the Arabian peninsula. Gary and his friends had to spend five days in Yemen's capital obtaining all the proper permits. Then it was off to three weeks on the island where such botanical treasures as twenty-five foot *Dorstenia gigas* and huge *Adenium socotranum* may be found. In addition, there are many species of *Euphorbia*, frankincense and myrrh. The group is preparing an upcoming article for the CSSA Journal on the classification of the six species of frankincense (*Boswellia*) that grow on the island.

Gary is an LBCC member who has entertained us many times with lectures on his trips to such places as Madagascar and Namibia. Since retiring six years ago from his post as Dean of Math and Science at Orange Coast College, he has spent much of his time traveling to collect seeds and propagate rare plants to reduce the pressure collectors have on wild populations. Join us for a rare look at a unique habitat in the company of an expert.

LOCATION: Dominguez Adobe, 18127 South Alameda Street, Compton, CA 90221. Take the 91 Redondo Beach/ Artesia Freeway and exit south on Alameda. Signs for the Adobe are posted on the freeway and on Alameda. Coming from the freeway, the entrance to the Adobe is on the right or west side of Alameda.
