# ALFRED LAU

PROGRAM: We are honored to have world-renowned plant explorer Dr. ALFRED LAU as our speaker this month. He will present a slide lecture retracing his travels in Peru and Northern Chile through the years. Dr. Lau has traveled extensively in Mexico, Central America and South America for the past four decades. His interests include cacti, carnivorous plants, orchids, passionflowers and bromeliads. He has discovered many new species as attested by how frequently his name appears in the plant literature (e.g., Mammillaria lauii). For many years he and his wife ran a school in Vera Cruz, Mexico for native Mexican children. Recently, he has been working with and educating villagers in Belize where he built an eco-trail. You can learn more about him at http://www.geocities.com/floral lectures. Don't miss this opportunity to hear Dr. Lau and see slides of the incredible plants he has encountered.

LOCATION: Dominguez Adobe, 18127 South Alameda Street, Rancho Dominguez, CA 90220. Take the 91 Redondo Beach/ Artesia Freeway and exit south on Alameda. Signs for the Adobe are posted on the freeway and on Alameda. Coming from the freeway, the entrance to the Adobe is on the right or west side of Alameda. We will meet in the cafeteria in the northeast of the big building next to the garden.

Cactus: Mammillaria clusters, hooked spine, 8" pot & under

Succulent: Tylecodon

#### 2002 PLANT-OF-THE-MONTH RULES

At the November, 1996 meeting, the following rules were adopted for the Plant-of the-Month (POM) competition:

- A maximum of three plants may be entered in each category (cactus and succulent).
- There will be three classes for entrants: advanced (blue tag), intermediate (pink tag) and beginner (yellow tag).
- Advanced and intermediate entrants must have had the plant in their possession for at least six months, beginners for three months.
- Entrants will receive 6 points for first place, 4 points for second place, 2 points for third place and 1 point for showing a plant that does not place.
- At the discretion of the judges there may be up to three third places in a category. If plants are not deemed to be of sufficient quality, no third place will be awarded.
- For an entrant to receive points, the entry tags must be collected by the person in charge of record keeping for POM.
- At the annual Christmas party, award plants will be presented to the ten highest cumulative point holders regardless of class.

#### AWARDS FOR REED PITZER AND FATHER PAT

An plaque for Exceptional Member Service was awarded to Reed Pitzer for his many, many hours of hard work for the club. Thank you, Reed!

An award of Life Time Membership was made to Father Pat McPolin for his gracious and loyal support of our club through the years. Father Pat filled us in on events at the Adobe:

#### **ALAMEDA CORRIDOR**

Street lights on Alameda are on again after nearly four years. Work on the Alameda Corridor is nearly finished. It will open on time and on budget at this location on April 15. Father Pat closely monitored the construction, wearing his hardhat with the "El Jefe" label. Due to his efforts trees will be planted every ten feet and the middle divider of the road will be paved with concrete cobblestones rather than asphalt. A fifteen foot high, graffiti-proof sound wall will separate the railroad tracks from the road.

REFURBISHING THE ADOBE

The Adobe has been closed for refurbishing four months and will be closed for another four. Repairing termite damage has cost \$120,000. The heirs of the Dominguez family have been helping; the building now has all new hardwood floors, but all new drapery is also needed. The county insists on earthquake retrofitting which is costing \$250,000. The exterior plaster is complete and looks magnificent. The stolen gates are being replaced. September is the target date when the Adobe, with everything first class, will reopen for tours. As noted on page 1, Father Pat would appreciate donations of cacti and succulents for the pots around the fountain and building.
