2008 LBCC PLANT-OF-THE-MONTH RULES

At the April, 2003 meeting, the following rules were adopted for the Plant-of the-Month (POM) competition:

- A maximum of three plants may be entered in each category (cactus and succulent).
- There will be three classes for entrants: advanced (blue tag), intermediate (pink tag) and beginner (yellow tag).
- Advanced and intermediate entrants must have had the plant in their possession for at least six months, beginners for three months.
- Entrants will receive 8 points for first place, 6 points for second place, 4 points for third place, 2 points for show/honorable mention (HM) and 1 point for showing a plant that does not place.
- At the discretion of the judges there may be up to three third places in a category. If plants are not deemed to be of sufficient quality, no third place will be awarded.
- For an entrant to receive points, the entry tags must be collected by the person in charge of record keeping for POM.
- At the annual Christmas party, award plants will be presented to the ten highest cumulative point holders regardless of class.

SPECIMEN AUCTION, SHOW QUALITY CACTI FROM THE Caro Desert Collection Saturday October 11, 2008

Rene and Patty Caro who have been collecting cacti and succulents for the past 15 years have decided to sell off their specimen plants. They were originally residents of Glendale, CA, and after many years decided to move to the Antelope Valley, CA, and for the past three years have lived in Durango, Colorado. During their time in the AV and Durango, they have grown some of the most perfect and beautiful cacti to be seen anywhere. Due to the very cold conditions and the cost of heating two greenhouses in Durango, they have decided that with most of their plants being very large, that they would sell off the big ones to make space for smaller ones. Their area of interest is primarily cacti and Rene has made a special effort of collecting *Ariocarpus*, *Astrophytums, Copiapoas, Gymnocalyciums, Turbinicarpus, Sulcorebutias, Aztekiums, Mammillarias, Strombocactus*, and many other genera, mostly the rare and unique collector type plants.

The great majority of the plants that will be available were grown from small seedlings and are now large, show quality, perfect specimens. Rene's sources were many of the well know growers such as; *Vince Basta, Larry Grammer, Dick Hulett, Woody Minnich, Gene Joseph, Victor Turicek, Tom Glavich, Miles Anderson, Peter Sharp, Ann Shein, Steve Southwell and Steve Brack.* Rene and Patty are not into showing plants and yet are often present at the Inter-City CSS and the San Gabriel Winter Show as helpers and observers and thus they know how to grow show quality material. Almost all their specimen plants have been grown in plastic or terracotta pots in a strong light condition at 7,000 ft. elevation. Most of these plants are just waiting for you to stage them and most of them will be show winners.

This auction will be conducted by Woody Minnich of Cactus Data Plants at the home of fellow collectors Dave and Khobe DeLucca at 5344 Greenmeadows Rd. Long Beach, CA. Their home is very near the northeast

corner of Carson and Bellflower. From the 91 Fwy south on Bellflower to Carson and from the 605 Fwy west on Carson to Bellflower. The auction will presented in a similar manner to the Sobel, Wakamatsu, Hulett, Pickoff, Johnson and Grammer auctions. E-mail, web-site, phone-in and in-person bidding will be accepted. Woody will represent electronic and phone-in bidders unable to attend the physical auction. All plants will be listed and pictured on the web-site and the description list will also accompany this flyer. Lists may also be requested via e-mail or phone and they will be sent electronically to your e-mail address

Viewing, and the written bidding will start at 9:30am and the verbal auction will begin at 11:00 am on Saturday the 11th. Electronic bids will be accepted until 8:00pm Oct. 8, 2008. Those persons wishing to place phone, e-mail or web-site bids should use the following procedure: Indicate your starting bid (equal to or greater than minimum), the increment of bid(s) and your final maximum bid. Example; Plant X has a minimum of \$50.00, your minimum bid must be equal to or greater than \$50.00. You start with a minimum of ? \$65.00 and you are willing to go as high as ? \$100.00. Your increment bids are ? \$5.00 each and will be applied until you win the bid or another bidder exceeds your maximum of \$100.00. CDP (Woody) will confidentially represent each electronic bidder and will only inform bidder, with a request following their original electronic bid, if they have been exceeded by other previous e-mail, phone or web-site bidders. Each top electronic bidder will then be confidentially represented at the final verbal physical auction with their increment of bid not to exceed their maximum. Those persons with e-mail, phone or web-site bids that are the final winners of the verbal portion, will be notified following the auction as to which plants they have won. At this time, the winning bidder may make arrangements to pick-up their plants or have CDP mail them. Shipping and handling and postage is estimated at 30% for surface (USA) and 40% for airmail (USA). All payments are to be made to CDP or Rene Caro with cash, check or credit card. Rene and Patty Caro and Cactus Data Plants (Woody) offer no guarantees or refunds, sales are final. All material will be mailed within two weeks of the conclusion of the auction.

- 94. **Rebutia heliosa v. cajasensis** 4" cluster, very tight and very rare x P. Sharp MB \$20.
- 95. Ariocarpus retusus f. furfuraceus 7" DIA very low, fat, perfect plant with heavy wrinkles x CDP MB \$125.
- 96. Turbinicarpus schmiedickianus v. gracilis 3" HI, fat, perfect plant with heavy spines x CDP MB \$25.
- 97. Gymnocalycium accoragatum 6" DIA very clean, great spines, ready for show MB \$20.
- 98. Oroya borchersii 5" DIA beautiful long golden spines, very clean x CDP MB \$15.
- 99. Uebelmannia pectinifera v. flavispina 5" HI, perfect, grafted low x CDP MB \$20.
- 100. Echinofossulocactus multicostatus 5" DIA perfect plant ready for Show, low fat, large for species x CDP MB \$25.
