From a talk by Myron Kimnach: If you feel uncomfortable with all the name changes that are occuring in the Cactaceae, go ahead and use the old names. Who knows, in a year or two, they may change back to the old names again. (paraphrase)

From the Sunset Succulent Society's Slightly Skinny Sheet for Oct. 88:

For his planting mix, Guy Wrinkle uses 2 parts LGM planter mix to 1 part pumice & fertilizes every watering at 1/4 strength. (Guy grows mostly succulents rather than cacti so others might increase the proportion of pumice. But one thing nice about this mix is its simplicity. Pumice can be obtained at Orange Cty. Farm Supply on Chapman in Orange, or at Manny Singers in Northridge. LGM can be obtained at many nurseries, but call first to be sure your nursery has it. For fertilizer many growers use Liquinox. Again, call around to find it. LBCC ed.)

One final recipe, from Havemeyer Lane:


RECIPE: FOR HOLIDAY DESERT


