November meeting program: Tom Glavich presents Winter Growing Succulents

This talk will look at winter growing succulents from three Mediterranean regions of the world. The first will be South Africa, followed by the Mediterranean and then the West Coast of California and Baja. This talk is a quick survey concentrating on showing a few examples of many genera, some common, and some rarely seen. It will conclude with a discussion of the basics of cultivation of winter growing plants.

Tom Glavich is a long time grower of succulent plants and bulbs. He is a member of several Los Angeles Area clubs, and is one of the co-chairs of the Inter-City Cactus and Succulent Show. He is a frequent speaker at Southern California Horticultural Societies and the author of over 100 articles for CSSA publications.

So, we can have the Holiday Party at this meeting or we can have the party at Sue's home as we did last party. Either way we will have to pay rent at the Woman's Club. Please bring your input to the meeting where we can decide how we want to proceed.

ELECTIONS

The offices of President, Treasurer, and Directors will be decided on at this meeting. We have some candidates ready for most of these positions.

The position of President asks first and foremost, that you are able to make non-biased decisions that are in the best interest of the club. It also requires that you keep an eye on the future of the club and plan for that as best you can. You need to be able to express your perceptions to the club and/or board so that action if necessary can be taken. You are the steering wheel; the club and board are the engine. The club will become stagnant if you both are not working together.

The position of Treasurer requires the ability to do bookkeeping for the club. It is important that the club's books are kept up to date. Quarterly and event reports are to be available when called for. This is necessary in order for the club to gain non-profit status. With this status comes many benefits; we can have bank accounts with tax ID#'s and the club will be able to take credit card payments for sales, auctions, online memberships and renewals. To maintain this status, record keeping is important. It is not as technical as you might think but current records are necessary for filing taxes every year.

Please consider becoming a part of the board as a Director. A board member is a club member who helps keep the club on a friendly and productive direction. In the position of director you will vote on decisions that will often decide the club's future. As director, you keep the club's best interest in mind when decisions are made.

There are 4 Director positions available. Two positions for two years and two for one year. This will only happen in this years election in order to get all the Director positions in place. After this election, all positions will be for a period of two years so each year two Director positions will be up for election.

MEETING SET-UP AND TEAR-DOWN
