PROGRAM: Jeff Chemnick: The Genera of Cycads

In our gardens we frequently couple our cactus and succulents with cycads. But, how much do you know about them? Jeff Chemnick is an authority on Mexican cycads and is a research associate at Lotusland. He has published numerous articles and has described species of cycads new to science. Jeff is owner and operator of Aloes-in-Wonderland, a specialty nursery in Santa Barbara where he has an amazing collection of cycads, agaves, aloes, and similar beautiful plants with radial symmetry. In addition to his nursery and field research he owns and operates Mexico Nature Tours and leads botanical and ornithological ecotours throughout the country with focus on the state of Oaxaca. He is also on the IUCN's Cycad Specialist Group which determines the status of endangered species.

His presentation will cover everything you might wish to know about cycads: taxonomy, biogeography, pollination and seed dispersal mechanisms, threats and status, as well as horticultural and cultivation tips.

TIME: Sunday, November 3rd, 2019 from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Please arrive at least half an hour early to set up Plants of the Month, buy plants from our vendors, ask questions regarding your plants, or socialize.



LOCATION: Rancho Los Alamitos, 6400 Bixby Hill Rd., Long Beach, CA. The Rancho is in a gated community, the entrance of which is at the south end of Palo Verde Ave. Tell the guard at the gate that you're going to the Cactus Club meeting. LBCC PLANT-OF-THE-MONTHS RULES

At the April, 2003 meeting, the following rules were adopted for the Plant-of the-Month (POM) competition:

- A maximum of three plants may be entered in each category (cactus and succulent).
- There will be three classes for entrants: advanced (blue tag), intermediate (pink tag) and beginner (yellow tag).
- Advanced and intermediate entrants must have had the plant in their possession for at least six months, beginners for three months.
- Entrants will receive 8 points for first place, 6 points for second place, 4 points for third place, 2 points for show/honorable mention (HM) and 1 point for showing a plant that does not place.
- At the discretion of the judges there may be up to three third places in a category. If plants are not deemed to be of sufficient quality, no third place will be awarded.
- For an entrant to receive points, the entry tags must be collected by the person in charge of record keeping for POM
- At the annual Christmas party, award plants will be presented to the ten highest cumulative point holders regardless
 of class.
