NORTHERN BAJA WITH JIM HANNA

PROGRAM: JIM HANNA will present a slide lecture on his Thanksgiving weekend trips to northern Baja California where he has been going since the late 1980s with wife Roberta and other cactophiles. This program will survey the territory from Tijuana to Guerrero Negro. We will see many boojums (*Idria columnaris*) and giant cordóns (*Pachycereus pringlei*) as well as Ferocactus, Pachycormus and Bursera in habitat.

Jim, an honorary member of LBCC, his home club, last spoke to us about his trip to Namibia. He served as treasurer for many years, as well as holding official positions in the other local clubs. He provides the plants for our door prizes. As a grower and exhibitor and organizer he has been a major presence in all the local shows for the past several decades.

LOCATION: Dominguez Adobe, 18127 South Alameda Street, Rancho Dominguez, CA 90220. Take the 91 Redondo Beach/ Artesia Freeway and exit south on Alameda. Signs for the Adobe are posted on the freeway and on Alameda. Coming from the freeway, the entrance to the Adobe is on the right or west side of Alameda. We will meet in the cafeteria in the northeast of the big building next to the garden.

2001 PLANT-OF-THE-MONTH RULES

At the November, 1996 meeting, the following rules were adopted for the Plant-of the-Month (POM) competition:

- A maximum of three plants may be entered in each category (cactus and succulent).
- There will be three classes for entrants: advanced (blue tag), intermediate (pink tag) and beginner (yellow tag).
- Advanced and intermediate entrants must have had the plant in their possession for at least six months. beginners for three months.
- Entrants will receive 6 points for first place, 4 points for second place, 2 points for third place and 1 point for showing a plant that does not place.
- At the discretion of the judges there may be up to three third places in a category. If plants are not deemed to be of sufficient quality, no third place will be awarded.
- For an entrant to receive points, the entry tags must be collected by the person in charge of record keeping
- At the annual Christmas party, award plants will be presented to the ten highest cumulative point holders regardless of class.


